Comments:

The 2013 Ducky Derby did a great job improving from last year's event. There were very few giveaways, which helped reduce waste. Reusable Items that were given out at the event included ducks, art projects, and reusable water bottles. ZGreen staff did not see any printed materials. The food and drink stations were excellent! All serving ware and cutlery were compostable. Bulk condiment containers were used and all tablecloths were reusable. The education sign at the entrance to the food area was very clear at communicating the importance of the Ducky Derby's ZGreen efforts. Waste stations were manned with rotary volunteers and that helps to reduce contamination of the recycling and compost bins. At the time ZGreen staff was at the event some of the volunteers had left their stations, but earlier in the day all waste stations were staffed. One of the biggest improvements over last year's event was that there was no bottled water being sold or given away. Only bulk water and bottled juices and sodas were available.

Opportunities for Improvement:

Overall the Ducky Derby did a great job at the 2013 event. One volunteer mentioned that they had seen Styrofoam containers, but ZGreen staff could not find any or determine which sponsor brought them. Please ensure that sponsors understand that Styrofoam is not allowed at events. Also there were two waste stations that did not include trash. There was one recycling bin located by the bottled/canned drink tent and a recycling and compost station that was by the food station. Even though these locations matched the type of bin that was there, trash bins should always be provided in addition to recycling and compost to reduce contamination. If the Ducky Derby would like to reduce carbon emissions further, they are encouraged to borrow Sunny the Solar Roller to power the music or other electrical equipment.
