Compost bins were clearly identified and indicated that spoons, cups, and soup could all be tossed in. Students from the local school helped staff the waste stations. Nice work partnering with the community. The placement of compost bins near the heat lamps was a good idea however, there was a people-jam created by people hovering around lamps which blocked access to the compost bins by other people. Only a few garbage cans at the back of the stations were noticed, which were approved for vendors. Attendees were educated about the event's greening efforts with announcements and signs posted at the event. Winterskol had a booth with some handouts and brochures, as did Anderson Ranch and the Chamber. No unnecessary schwag was noticed. New in 2012, voting was conducted via text message, which eliminated the need for slips of paper and cardboard collection bins. Great job!
