

You don't need a car to get around Aspen!

Convenient shuttles serve popular attractions like the Maroon Bells and the Aspen Music Festival in the summer. Parking is limited at the Aspen Music Festival and vehicular traffic is prohibited to the Maroon Bells during peak summer hours.

YEAR ROUND

FREE and frequent transit service is available in Aspen, serving local attractions as well as the airport. Shuttles depart from the Rubey Park transit station, located on Durant Street, across from the Silver Circle Ice Arena. All bus service between Aspen and the Town of Snowmass Village is FREE. Bus service to other local communities is available for a fee.

GETTING TO THE AIRPORT

Taxi and limousine services greet every flight at the Aspen/Pitkin County Airport. Many lodges provide courtesy van service to or from the airport and around town. Free RFTA buses also travel between Aspen and the airport.

FROM DENVER OR EAGLE COUNTY AIRPORTS

A variety of shuttle providers offer safe, convenient service to Aspen and Snowmass Village including Colorado Mountain Express offering six daily departures to and from Denver.

TRAILS AND PATHS

The Roaring Fork Valley is home to the Rio Grande Trail, a 44 mile stretch of scenic trail between Aspen and Glenwood Springs. Aspen's trail system is available year-round for hikers, cyclists, equestrians, cross-country skiers and more.



MAROON BELLS SCENIC BUS TOUR *(Summer Only)*

This fare-based bus tour departs Aspen Highlands Village base area every 20-30 minutes in the summer season. Tickets are available at Four Mountain Sports in Aspen or at Aspen Highlands Village.

ASPEN TRANSPORTATION APP OPTIONS



TRANSIT APP allows you to view live bus schedules, check out a WE-cycle bike, plan your trip, set reminders and get news alerts.



RFTA APP provides bus information including real-time bus locations and ETAs, arrival notifications, route schedule and rider alerts.



DOWNTOWNER APP offers access to FREE golf cart transportation around Aspen. Operates summer season, 11 a.m. - 11 p.m.

CROSS-TOWN SHUTTLE (Summer & Winter Only)

Serves many of Aspen's greatest attractions including the Aspen Music Festival's concert facilities, Aspen Meadows and the Aspen Club & Spa.

CASTLE MAROON

Provides service from town to Maroon Creek Road and Castle Creek Road serving Aspen Valley Hospital, Aspen Highlands Village and the Aspen Recreation Center.

CEMETERY LANE

Travels from Rubey Park to the Cemetery Lane residential area. For a scenic walk, exit the shuttle on Red Butte Drive and walk back to town via the Rio Grande Trail.

HUNTER CREEK

Serves the residential area of Hunter Creek, providing access to grocery shopping and Aspen's Post Office. Also travels near the popular Smuggler Mountain trail.

BURLINGAME/HWY 82 SHUTTLE

Provides service from Rubey Park to the Burlingame Ranch housing complex via Hwy 82. This route is a convenient option for reaching the Aspen Golf Course or Buttermilk Mountain.

MOUNTAIN VALLEY DIAL-A-RIDE

Serves the Mountain Valley residential area on a fixed route free of charge. Provides door-to-door service in this area for \$1. Call 970.920.9999 to schedule personalized service.

WE-CYCLE BIKESHARING PROGRAM

Bike sharing is for quick, point-to-point trips. WE-cycle is an easy, fast, and fun way for locals, commuters and visitors to get around town. Sign up for 24 hours, 3 days, 30 days or a season at any of the numerous stations for access to more than 100 bikes, 24/7. Buy a pass at any station or visit we-cycle.org for passes, ride ideas and information.





P Parking Options

(Prices are subject to change.)

RESIDENTIAL-AREA PARKING

FREE parking in residential neighborhoods is restricted to a maximum of two hours from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. The two-hour limit may be exceeded with the purchase of a one-day pass. Day passes can be purchased via parking meters located on each block in residential zones.

FREE PARKING AT BRUSH CREEK PARK & RIDE

FREE parking is available at the Brush Creek Park & Ride at the intersection of Hwy 82 and Brush Creek Road. Free and frequent bus service is provided between the Park & Ride and downtown Aspen as well as to the Town of Snowmass Village. Call **970.925.8484** for bus schedules.



DOWNTOWN PARKING

Look for pay stations mid-block throughout the downtown area. Insert coins or a credit card and display your receipt face-up on the driver's side of your dashboard. Downtown parking is limited to a maximum of four hours.

RIO GRANDE PARKING PLAZA

The Rio Grande Parking Plaza, conveniently located next to the Aspen Visitor Center, offers 24-hour covered parking at a low price! Parking in the Plaza can be purchased by the hour or day from **pay stations** located inside the parking plaza that accept Visa, MasterCard or American Express. Parking is FREE from 5 p.m. to 5 a.m. Ten-visit and monthly passes are also available.
